Final report from Teesmouth Field Centre for the Habitats in Focus project 17.09.2018

Tell us about yourselves

Teesmouth Field Centre became a Charitable Incorporated Organisation in 2015. The Field Centre was established in 1970 on a not- for- profit basis. Teesmouth Field Centre has a team of 4 Trustees and 2 staff.

There were no surplus funds and no further funding was required to complete this project. The Hands on Habitats project involved a specific number of project days (15) as listed in the application. After notifying the schools, bookings are then taken for that number of days, so there is no under- or- overspend.

Tell us about the project

Has the project been successful and well received by the beneficiaries?

A total of 513 children and 97 accompanying adults (teachers, teaching assistants, parents) have been involved. They all enjoyed the outdoor learning experience and used the simple apparatus to record their findings. With Year 1 pupils, the adults used the cameras, but with all other year groups, the children shared a camera between two, and decided what to record. Most of the pupils made and recorded direct observations of the wildlife found in the different habitats within the Teesmouth National Nature Reserve and noted the problems that human visitors leave behind. Overall, the age of the pupils ranged from 5/6 to 10/11 years.

Teesmouth Field Centre staff were very satisfied with the outcome of this project. One booking had to be modified due to school staff absence, so the TFC staff went to the school and used the school grounds for the fieldwork. The project days were spread out over 15 months, which was a longer period than usual, as bad weather conditions meant a couple of cancellations late in 2017 and a slow start in 2018.
