

Project Activities

Endeavour have developed teaching gardens in Sheffield for young people who are highly deprived or newly arrived to country.

This Teaching Garden has helped 136 young people have fun in the fresh air whilst working with their hands. They learned how to plant seeds, nurture growing plants, harvest produce and ultimately understand the value of good eating habits and learn about nutrition. This has also helped young people to engage with their surroundings better and develop a sense of responsibility.

Project activities over a 12 month period were:

17 workshops which enabled young people to

- develop communication skills
- understanding of team working
- leadership skills
- gain horticulture knowledge
- design skills

23 group sessions which ensured


- physical activity of gardening so improvement of physical and mental health
- construction of raised beds for enjoyment of communities
- growing of vegetables gaining understanding of food processes

4 garden sales offering

- planters, hanging baskets, plants for sale
- understanding of personal finance
- development of communication and customer service skills

Achievements

- 135 young people developed knowledge of horticulture and science and participated in gardening activities.
- 135 young people achieved various horticulture accreditation such as BTEC Entry Level
 Certificate in Practical Horticulture, ABC Awards Level 1 Land based Studies
- 18 young people progressed into a BTEC horticulture course or science related programme when they moved on from Endeavour.
- 135 young people reported improved mental health and emotional wellbeing
- 135 young people reported a better and healthier lifestyle as a consequence of improved knowledge of nutrition and physical health
- 135 young people had increased employment and education opportunities from skills developed
- 38 new volunteers
- Young people, staff and the local community have all reported feeling better about their working and local environment because of the improved appearance of the site
- · 81% stated development of life skills such as confidence, teamwork and communication
- 78% confirmed improved knowledge about the environment and sustainability

Project Case Study

'Patience' aged 15 years old has been living in Sheffield for 2 years 6 months, coming from a town in Somalia. Patience lived in extreme poverty with little education and struggled with everyday life. Arriving in England with her mother, Patience was overwhelmed by the busy roads, large amounts of people and noise. This translated into her being nervous and anxious. Patience loves the garden. Not only has she developed gardening skills and about horticulture, the Teaching Garden has enabled her to communicate with peers, talk to staff about personal issues, and allowed herself to be supported. Patience has created her own hanging basket to take home, which gave her and her mother a great deal of pleasure 'its so pretty – something beautiful in our home'.
