We are Wildgoose Rural Training, we provide day care and training for adults with learning or physical disabilities. We also offer provision for young people who find the classroom environment difficult to handle.

 Yes, the project was completed and is part of the main infrastructure of the new site. As such we maintain the building as we would with the rest of the site with regular weather protection and checking. Our staff are tasked with the general maintenance of the site to ensure the longevity of our resources.

The barn and polytunnel are now a particularly important part of the entire project. Due to the Covid crisis we have developed two classrooms within the structure of the barn and added a toilet block. This has allowed us to maintain social distancing and create "bubbles" to keep the risk to our students as low as possible. Overall, the barn and polytunnel are now used daily to provide teaching space, workshops, and animal housing.

 We received other funds towards the building as the total spend was around £50,000, most of the funding came from an RDPE grant and a private donor. The grant from Nineveh Charitable Trust enabled us to create a pole barn that was finished to a high standard and was able to meet our needs now and into the future.

 The process was transparent with a fair application process, the receipt of funds was easy without any unnecessary hold-ups or delays, at the time this was important to us.

We are working on a brochure at the moment to highlight the journey we have been on and to say thanks to all of the funders who very kindly donated to our work. We have built a new site from the ground up in the last two and half years so there was many people and funders involved in creation of the finished project, although, we are not standing still and intend to also create a visitor/education centre for visitors to the wildlife reserve.
